

2009 APTi Awards In Depth

The APT awards program is designed to recognize outstanding achievements of members expanding the knowledge of type, its theory and the APTi organization internationally. The following awards will be presented or recognized at the APTi Conference in Dallas, Texas in 2009.

<b>Mary McCaulley Lifetime Achievement Award</b>	
This reward recognizes:	Recognizes an individual who, through a body of work spanning a number of years, has made a significant contribution in encouraging the constructive use of differences identified by psychological type
The recipient must be:	Member of APTI
Nominations can be made by:	Individual member of APTI or a chapter
The recipient receives:	\$1000 and a plaque/certificate
Number of awards presented at each Conference (every other year):	One
Nomination procedure:	Individuals may nominate a candidate by submitting a completed nomination form, including a summary of the individual's demonstrated contributions. The summary should include: how the nominee contributed to the constructive use of differences, how the individual embodies the spirit of both Isabel Myers and Mary McCaulley in demonstrating the ability to listen to and respect all individuals; what is outstanding about the nominee's actions and accomplishments, the beneficiaries, the long-term impact, and how the nominee has exemplified APTi values and ethics.

<b>Gordon Lawrence Education Achievement Award</b>	
This reward recognizes:	This award recognizes an outstanding

	contribution to the field of education that promotes the constructive use of psychological type.
The recipient must be:	A member of APTI
Nominations can be made by:	Chapter or individual member
The recipient receives:	\$500 and a plaque/certificate
Number of awards presented at each Conference (every other year):	One
Nomination procedure:	Individuals may nominate a candidate by submitting a completed nomination form, including a summary of demonstrated contributions. This summary should include: what is outstanding about the nominee's contribution to the field of education; who were or are the beneficiaries; what challenges has the nominee encountered and surmounted; what is the long-term impact and how has the nominee exemplified the values and ethics of APT.

Innovations Award	
This reward recognizes:  <b>NOTE: This is a new award</b>	This award recognizes significant innovations in the development of, the teaching of and/or the practice/implementation of type or its theory. This could involve groundbreaking theory development, innovative methods in conveying the information, innovative type identification methods, or innovative practical applications of psychological type.
The recipient must be:	An individual member of APTI or a group

Nominations can be made by:	Chapter or individual member
The recipient receives:	A 5-year membership to APTI, a certificate/plaque and a press release announcing the award
Number of awards presented at each Conference (every other year):	To an individual or group
Nomination procedure:	Individuals may nominate a candidate by submitting a completed nomination form, including a summary of demonstrated contributions. This summary should include: what are the innovations or new ways of considering type that the individual or group displayed; who were or are the beneficiaries; what is the long-term impact to the field.

Excellence in APTi Leadership	
This reward recognizes:  <b>NOTE: This award has been changed from past awards</b>	This award recognizes significant volunteer leadership contribution to APTi at any organizational level (e.g., country, region, chapter, or interest area) or in any field of service. This Award is to honor and appreciate consistent and dedicated service to APTi, in any part of our umbrella organization and all APTi-affiliated groups or units.
The recipient must be:	Member of APTi
Nominations can be made by:	Member of APTi
The recipient receives:	A free workshop registration to one-day APTI event, to be taken within a 12 month time period, a plaque/certificate, a press release announcing the award

Number of awards presented at each Conference (every other year):	Up to 3 awards
Nomination procedure:	Individuals may nominate a candidate by submitting a completed nomination form, including a summary of demonstrated contributions. This summary should include: what are some specific accomplishments; in what ways did they contribute, perhaps as an unsung hero who worked behind the scenes; how did their contribution strengthen the mission of APTi.

<b>Otto Kroeger Organizational Excellence Award</b>	
This reward recognizes:  <b>NOTE: This award has been renamed to honor Otto Kroeger</b>	This award honors an organization outside the field of psychological type for ethically using type to improve its business practices and the work lives of its employees.
The recipient must be:	An organization such as a non-profit or business
Nominations can be made by:	An APTi member
The recipient receives:	A free workshop registration to one-day APTI event, to be taken within a 12 month time period , a one-year membership to APTI, a press release announcing the award
Number of awards presented at each Conference (every other year):	One
Nomination procedure:	Individuals may nominate a candidate by submitting a completed nomination form, including a summary of demonstrated contributions. This summary should include: what are some

	specific accomplishments; in what ways did they use type to accomplish their goals; in what way did type change their organization.
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<b>The Presidents' Award</b>	
This reward recognizes:	During each APTi conference, the Presidents of APTi (past, current, and president-elect) may honor exceptional service to the Association. The recipient of the President's Award is a person who has contributed time and talent over many years, supporting the work of APTi by serving on committees, working on other APTi initiatives & activities, and promoting the ethical use of type within their communities.
The recipient must be:	A member of APTi
Nominations can be made by:	The 3 current APTi Presidents (current, past and president-elect)
The recipient receives:	A free workshop registration to a one-day APTi event or free conference registration, to be taken within a 12 month time period, a letter and certificate/plaque
Number of awards presented at each Conference (every other year):	Up to one. The Presidents can choose not to make an award.
Nomination procedure:	The Presidents will meet and agree on a whether to make an award and to what recipient. They will write a description of the accomplishments and the contributions to APTi.
